CARPENTERSVILLE MAN GETS PRISON SENTENCE FOR SEXUAL CONTACT WITH TEENAGER

A Carpentersville man has been sent to prison for having sexual contact with a teenage girl he knew.

Johnny Haskins, 43 (d.o.b. 5-23-1969), of the 1-99 block of Oxford Drive, Carpentersville, was sentenced late Wednesday, Aug. 22, 2012, Associate Judge Clint Hull to three years in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

Haskins was convicted June 27, 2012, by a Kane County jury of two counts of aggravated criminal sexual abuse, each a Class 2 felony.

Between January 2009 and November 2009, Haskins had sexual contact with a girl he knew. The victim was younger than 17 at the time of the contact. The victim reported the contact to a school counselor, who alerted authorities.

According to Illinois law, Haskins is eligible for day-for-day credit. He was given credit for at least 285 days in the Kane County jail, where he had been held since his arrest.

In addition, Haskins must register for life as a sex offender in accordance with the Illinois Sex Offender Registration Act.

"At the very least, the most vulnerable in our community must be allowed to feel safe in their own homes, in their own bedrooms. We will continue to vigorously defend our children when they are victimized by those who willfully violate that sanctity," Kane County State's Attorney Joe McMahon said.

The case was prosecuted by Kane County Assistant State's Attorneys Nydia Molina and Debra Bree, who are assigned to the Kane County Child Advocacy Center.
