MAPLE PARK MAN GETS PRISON TERM FOR SEXUALLY ABUSING CHILD

December 6, 2012

A rural Maple Park man has been sentenced to prison for having sexual contact with a young girl he knew.

Antonio Arceo-Lomeli, 45 (d.o.b. 7-5-1967), of the 07N block of McGough Road, Maple Park, was sentenced Friday, Nov. 30, 2012, by Associate Judge James C. Hallock to five years in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

On Oct. 19, 2012, Arceo-Lomeli pleaded guilty to one count of aggravated criminal sexual abuse, a Class 2 felony, and one count of domestic battery, a Class A misdemeanor.

Between Jan. 1, 2011, and Feb. 4, 2012, Arceo-Lomeli had sexual contact with a young girl he knew. The child was younger than 13 at the time of the contact.

In addition, on Feb. 4, 2012, Arceo-Lomeli punched a family member with his fist.

According to Illinois law, Arceo-Lomeli is eligible for day-for-day sentencing. He was given credit for at least 301 days served in the Kane County jail.

The case was prosecuted by Kane County Assistant State's Attorney Lori Schmidt, who is assigned to the Child Advocacy Center.
