AURORA MAN TO GO TO PRISON FOR SEXUAL CONTACT WITH TEEN

October 29, 2012

An Aurora man will go to prison for having sexual contact with a teenage girl he knew.

José M. Ruiz-Ramirez, 33 (d.o.b. 7-24-1979), of the 300 block of North Ohio Street, Aurora, on Thursday, Oct. 25, 2012, agreed with the Kane County State's Attorney to a sentence of eight years in the Illinois Department of Corrections in exchange for a guilty plea to one count of criminal sexual assault, a Class 1 felony.

Circuit Judge David R. Akemann accepted the plea.

Between July 1, 2011, and Nov. 30, 2011, Ruiz-Ramirez had sexual contact with the victim at least 10 times at his residence. The victim, whom Ramirez-Ruiz knew, was younger than 18 years old at the time of the contact.

In addition to the prison term, Ruiz-Ramirez must register for life in accordance with the Illinois Sex Offender Registration Act.

According to Illinois law, Ruiz-Ramirez must serve at least 85 percent of the sentence. He was given credit for at least 322 days served in the Kane County jail.

The case was investigated by the Aurora Police Department and the Kane County Child Advocacy Center, and prosecuted by Kane County Assistant State's Attorney Debra Bree.
