FORMER GENEVA STUDENT SENTENCED TO PROBATION FOR THREATENING SCHOOL OFFICIAL

A former Geneva schools student has been sentenced to probation for threatening a Geneva school official via email last year.

Daniel T. Diomedes, 19 (d.o.b. 3-17-1993), now of St. Charles, was sentenced today by Associate Judge James C. Hallock to 30 months' probation and other conditions.

Diomedes was convicted May 24, 2012, by Judge Hallock, of one count of disorderly conduct, a Class 4 felony. Diomedes waived his right to a jury trial.

On April 26, 2011, Diomedes sent to a third-party witness an email in which he threatened to kill a dean at Geneva High School. The witness then contacted the Geneva Police Department and Geneva High School. Diomedes was a student at the school at the time.

Judge Hallock also ordered today that Diomedes must:

- Serve 101 days in the Kane County jail (Diomedes was given credit for 101 days served in the jail, so he will serve no further jail time)
- Remain on GPS monitoring, a condition he will re-evaluate in 12 months
- Strictly follow all doctor's orders relative to medication for depression
- Avoid contact with the victim
- Avoid violating state laws and local ordinances
- Not enter Geneva High School

Diomedes had been free on \$2,000 bond and GPS monitoring.

The case was prosecuted by Kane County Assistant State's Attorneys Deborah Lang and Andrew Whitfield.
