CHICAGO MAN PLEADS GUILTY TO JANUARY 2019 ARMED ROBBERY IN CARPENTERSVILLE, GETS 20-YEAR PRISON SENTENCE

June 25, 2019

26-year-old **Antonio D. Young** on July 23, 2020, agreed to a sentence of 20 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections in exchange for a guilty plea to the offense of armed robbery, Class X felony.

Kane County Circuit Judge John A. Barsanti accepted the plea.

Kane County Assistant State's Attorney Joseph Gay stated in court that at about 5:30 p.m. Jan. 14, 2019, Young entered a gas station in the 1300 block of Kings Road, Carpentersville. Young purchased a cigar and waited for other customers to leave. He approached the clerk again, asked what he could buy for 50 cents, pulled out a handgun and demanded money. As the clerk – the victim – attempted to retrieve a phone and push Young away, Young struck the victim on the head and face with the gun. Young then punched and knocked down the victim, took a bottle of liquor and cash, and fled.

In addition, Judge Barsanti ordered Young to pay \$1,562.40 in restitution to cover the victim's medical expenses. Judge Barsanti also recommended that Young receive treatment for substance use disorder while in prison.

In accordance with Illinois law, Young is eligible for day-for-day sentencing. He receives credit for 557 days served in the Kane County jail, where he had been held since his arrest.

The Carpentersville Police Department conducted the investigation.
