AURORA MAN GETS 14 YEARS FOR CHILD SEX ASSAULTS

March 14, 2022

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that Kane County Judge Alice C. Tracy has sentenced 31-year-old **Marcus Currie** to 14 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

A Kane County jury in August found Currie guilty of the offense of predatory criminal sexual assault of a child, Class X felony, 2 counts.

Kane County Assistant State's Attorneys Tyler Cox and Stacey Wittman presented evidence that between February 2018 and January 2019 Currie sexually assaulted the victim, who was younger than 13 years old. Currie was living with the victim's family.

Currie at the time was on mandatory supervised release (parole) for a 2015 drug offense in Fayette County.

The sentence is seven years for each count, to be served consecutive to one another. Currie had faced a sentence of between 12 and 120 years in prison. At the sentencing hearing, ASA Cox requested 22 years in prison for Currie.

According to Illinois law, Currie must serve at least 85 percent of the sentence. He receives credit for 1,112 days served in the Kane County jail, where he had been held since his arrest.

In addition to the prison term, Currie must register for life as a sexual offender in accordance with the Illinois Sexual Offender Registration Act.

ASA Cox said:

"I am proud of this child victim for her strength and persistence throughout this prosecution. I hope this sentence allows her to be in a place of safety. Thanks to the staff at the Kane County Child Advocacy Center for their work in this case."
