AURORA MAN GETS 30 YEARS IN PRISON FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED BATTERY

RE: Francisco L. Manriquez: Age 53 (d.o.b. 11-2-1969), of the 700 block of West Sullivan Road, Aurora, Illinois. Case No. 2020CF257.

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that Judge David P. Kliment has sentenced **Francisco L. Manriquez** to 30 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

A jury in February 2023 found Manriquez guilty of the offenses of:

- Aggravated criminal sexual assault Class X felony (2 counts)
- Criminal sexual assault Class 1 felony (4 counts)
- Aggravated battery Class 3 felony (1 count)

Assistant State's Attorneys Amanda Busljeta and Hillary Sadler presented the following evidence in court:

On February 5, 2020, Manriquez sexually assaulted the first victim, who was unable to consent to the act. He then battered the second victim, who was seven months pregnant, when she walked in and witnessed the sexual assault.

Manriquez faced a minimum sentence of 12 years in prison.

In accordance with Illinois law, Manriquez must serve at least 85 percent of the sentence. He receives credit for 1,152 days served in the Kane County jail.

In addition to the prison term, Manriquez must register for life as a sex offender in accordance with the Illinois Sex Offender Registration Act.

ASA Busljeta said: "Mr. Manriquez's criminal actions were a selfish betrayal of the trust the victims believed they could place in him. He clearly knew what he was doing was wrong, but that did not stop him. This is an appropriate sentence. Thanks to ASA Sadler, victim advocates Sheila Gray, Nancy Sebastian and Martha Martinez, as well as the Aurora Police Department for their incredible work on this case."
