MICHAL WYBRANIEC OF SOUTH ELGIN FACES MURDER CHARGES IN STABBING DEATH OF HIS MOTHER JUDGE SETS BAIL AT \$2 MILLION

*RE: **Michal Wybraniec**: Age 30 (d.o.b. 10-8-1992), of the 200 block of Thornwood Way, South Elgin, Illinois. Case No. 2023CF783.*

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser and South Elgin Chief of Police Jerry Krawczyk announce that **Michal Wybraniec** is charged with the offenses of first-degree murder (two counts), and armed violence, Class X felony.

State's Attorney Mosser alleges that, on April 16, 2023, Wybraniec stabbed his mother, 53-year-old Beata Wybraniec, multiple times with a knife causing her death. The incident began inside the South Elgin residence they shared. Beata Wybraniec attempted to flee from the defendant but he caught her outside and resumed stabbing her.

Wybraniec appeared today in Kane County bond court. Judge Salvatore LoPiccolo set Wybraniec's bail at \$2 million, with 10 percent (\$200,000) to apply for bond.

Judge LoPiccolo set Wybraniec's next court appearance for April 26, 2023 at 9 a.m. in Courtroom 319 at the Kane County Judicial Center.

If convicted, Wybraniec faces a sentence of between 20 and 60 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

The South Elgin Police Department and Kane County Major Crimes Task Force conducted the investigation with assistance from the Elgin Police Department. The Kane County Sheriff's Office, Campton Hills Police Department, South Elgin & Countryside Fire Protection District and Kane County Office of Emergency Management assisted at the scene.

The charges against Michal Wybraniec are not proof of guilt. Wybraniec is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair trial in which it is the state's burden to prove his guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
