ST. CHARLES TOWNSHIP MAN GUILTY OF CHILD SEX ASSAULT

JESUS MACIEL FACIO PLACED ON HOME MONITORING UNTIL SENTENCING July 10, 2023

RE: **Jesus J. Maciel Facio**: Age 34 (d.o.b. 7-6-1988), of the 38W5 block of Campton Hills Drive, St. Charles Township, Illinois. Case No. 2021CF1874.

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that Judge Alice Tracy has found **Jesus J. Maciel Facio** guilty of the offenses of:

- Predatory criminal sexual assault of a child, Class X felony
- Aggravated criminal sexual abuse, Class 2 felony (3 counts)
- Indecent solicitation of a child, Class 3 felony

Maciel Facio waived his right to a jury trial.

Kane County Assistant State's Attorneys Tyler Cox and Morgan Wilkinson presented the following facts during the hearing:

Between June 2016 and June 2019, Maciel Facio had sexual contact with the victim. Maciel Facio knew the victim, who was younger than 13 years old.

Judge Tracy set Maciel Facio's next court appearance for August 30, 2023 at 1:30 p.m. for motions and sentencing in Courtroom 311 at the Kane County Judicial Center.

Maciel Facio must register for life as a sexual offender in accordance with the Illinois Sexual Offender Registration Act.

Maciel Facio had been free on \$5,000 bond. Judge Tracy modified his bond conditions by placing him on electronic home monitoring until his sentencing hearing.

ASA Cox said: "This defendant counted on not being held accountable for his actions by exploiting a position of trust and pressuring the victim not to tell others that he was abusing her. The victim remained steadfast from the day that she reported the abuse until the day she testified at trial. This successful prosecution was possible because of this courageous child and her supportive family. I am proud of the victim and her family for remaining strong throughout the process. Thanks to the hardworking staff at the Kane County Child Advocacy Center for their support, particularly victim advocate Julie Pohlman and Det. Deanna Velazquez of the Kane County Sheriff's Office."
