JOSHUA DOSS GETS 23 YEARS IN PRISON FOR HOME INVASION, STABBING

July 25, 2023

RE: Joshua A. Doss: Age 43 (d.o.b. 4-7-1981), of the 116 block of Woodcreek South, Huntley, Illinois. Case No. 2020CF2417.

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that **Joshua A. Doss** has agreed to a sentence of 23 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections in exchange for a guilty plea to the offense of home invasion, Class X felony.

Judge John Barsanti accepted the plea.

Kane County Assistant State's Attorney Kelly M. Orland stated the following facts in court:

On December 28, 2020, Doss entered a home in the 3100 block of Merrywell Court, Carpentersville, despite a court order that prohibited him from being there. It was his marital residence and he was going through a divorce. His estranged wife was present along with the victim. Doss, armed with a knife, pushed past his estranged wife and lunged at the victim, stabbing him in the chest area and forearm. The victims fled the residence. Police found the defendant in the master bedroom of the home. The victim spent five days in the hospital after undergoing surgery to the knife wounds.

In accordance with Illinois law, Doss must serve at least 85 percent of the sentence. He receives credit for 923 days served in the Kane County jail, where he had been held since his arrest in lieu of \$500,000 bail.

ASA Orland said: "Mr. Doss' actions turned an emotional situation into an unnecessary, violent and bloody one. Given the severity of his injuries, the victim is lucky to be alive. My thanks to the Carpentersville Police Department and Det. Fred Hailer for the outstanding investigation, and to victim advocate Linda Hagemann.
