Kane County State's Attorney's Office Participates in "Safe Suburbs" Panel Discussion

Geneva, Ill. - Assistant State's Attorney Robert Dore of the Kane County State's Attorney's Office recently participated in a panel discussion focused on public safety, hosted by Safe Suburbs USA. The event, which took place last Tuesday, brought together experts and community leaders to address critical issues related to crime trends and legislative initiatives affecting Kane County.

Dore, a seasoned prosecutor of 24 years with 16 years of experience in combating internet crimes against children, joined State Senators Don DeWitte and Linda Holmes, Undersheriff Amy Johnson, and retired Naperville detective Rich Wistocki in an engaging dialogue aimed at enhancing public safety in our communities.

During the discussion, Dore highlighted the alarming rise in child sexual exploitation cases in Kane County and the proactive measures undertaken by the State's Attorney's Office to address this pressing issue. He emphasized the importance of collaboration between law enforcement agencies and legislative bodies in combating online predators and ensuring the safety of our children.

The panel also addressed concerns regarding vehicle thefts and retail theft smash-and-grabs, as well as the impact of legislative measures such as the SAFE-T Act on pretrial detention practices.

The Kane County State's Attorney's Office remains steadfast in its mission to uphold justice, promote public safety, and serve the residents of Kane County.
