**MARSEILLES MAN CHARGED WITH VIOLATIONS AFTER STRIKING
KANE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE VEHICLE**

RE: Indalecio Munoz: 53 (d.o.b. 07/23/1970), of the 1100 block of Madison Blvd, Marseilles, Illinois. Case No. 2024CF314.

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that **Indalecio Munoz** is charged with the offenses of:

- Commercial Motor Vehicle Violations (Class 3 Felony) – 5 counts
- Aggravated Reckless Driving (Class 4 Felony) – 1 count
- Commercial Motor Vehicle Violations (Class C Misdemeanor) – 1 count
- Commercial Motor Vehicle Violations (Petty Offense) – 12 counts
- Improper Lane Usage (Petty Offense) – 1 count
- Overweight on Registration (Petty Offense) – 1 count

State's Attorney Mosser alleges that, on or about October 23, 2023, Indalecio Munoz was driving a commercial motor vehicle on Illinois Route 47 when he crossed into oncoming traffic and struck a vehicle being driven by on duty Kane County Sheriff's Detective Brian Anderson head on. Detective Anderson suffered serious injuries as a result of the crash. An investigation revealed multiple commercial motor vehicle violations by the vehicle driven by Mr. Munoz.

After a hearing on a Petition to Detain Mr. Munoz, a Kane County judge ordered him released from custody with the conditions that he not drive any motor vehicle, not consume alcohol, not consume any intoxicating compounds and that he not have any contact with Detective Anderson.

The defendant's next court appearance is scheduled for March 7, 2024 at 9 a.m. in Courtroom 211 at the Kane County Judicial Center.

The charges against Munoz are not proof of guilt. Munoz is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair trial in which it is the state's burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
