Kane County State's Attorney's Office will Receive \$1 Million Grant Thanks to Senator Holmes

St. Charles, Ill. - Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announced that Senator Linda Holmes, Assistant Senate Majority Leader, has successfully secured \$1 million in funding for the Kane County State's Attorney's Office in the fiscal year 2025 state budget. This grant, appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO), will allow for an expansion of the county's efforts to keep the public safe.

"We are incredibly fortunate to have Leader Holmes representing us in Springfield as a strong advocate for public safety and law enforcement," Mosser said. "This funding will guarantee expanded domestic violence efforts and implementation of new criminal justice reforms."

State's Attorney Mosser recently spent several days in Springfield advocating for increased judicial and public safety funding. Leader Holmes has been an unwavering supporter of important legislation for Kane County, such as a new law last year that helps law enforcement use drones to investigate emergencies and at large public gatherings.

Mosser said the funding will be used for personnel as part of the county's domestic violence effort, including prosecutors and advocates to protect victims. The grant will also be able to counteract staff increases mandated by the SAFE-T Act and Pre-Trial Fairness Act, reforms that have mandated additional prosecutorial assignments.

"I want to make sure that our prosecutors and public safety personnel have the tools and resources they need to combat crime," Leader Holmes said. "I'm impressed with the innovative ideas that State's Attorney Mosser is implementing to expand our justice system, and I was glad to partner with her to help combat rising costs with implementation of new criminal justice laws in the state."
