**KANE COUNTY STATE'S ATTORNEY CHARGES AURORA
RESIDENT WITH KIDNAPPING AND BATTERY**

*RE: **Daniel J. Raines**: Age 19 (d.o.b. 4-28-2005), of the 200 block of E. Galena Blvd, Aurora, Illinois. Case No. 2024CF1061.*

St. Charles, Ill. - Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser and Aurora Chief of Police Keith Cross announce that **Daniel J. Raines** is charged with the offenses of:

- Kidnapping, Class 2 felony
- Aggravated Battery Public Way, Class 3 felony
- Attempted Kidnapping, Class 3 felony
- Battery, Class A felony

State's Attorney Mosser alleges that on May 22, 2024, Daniel J. Raines came from behind the victim and grabbed her around the chest, covered her mouth with his hand, and forcefully dragged her down an alleyway while on a public way. In doing so he made physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature and caused bodily harm to the victim.

According to Illinois law, Raines is being detained in the Kane County jail while his case is pending.

Raines's next court appearance is scheduled for May 31 at 9 a.m. in Courtroom 311 at the Kane County Judicial Center.

If convicted, the defendant faces a sentence of between 3 and 7 years of imprisonment on the first count, between 2 and 5 years of imprisonment on the second and third counts, or probation on any or all charges.

The charges against Raines are not proof of guilt. Raines is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair trial in which it is the state's burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
