North Aurora Man Pleads Guilty to Aggravated DUI Causing Death in Batavia Crash Involving Motorcycle

RE: Luis Aca Osorio: *Age 40 (d.o.b. 07/30/1984), of the 100 block of Dee Road, North Aurora, Illinois. Case No. 2023CF934.*

St. Charles, Ill. - Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that **Luis Aca Osorio** has agreed to a sentence of eight years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections in exchange for a guilty plea to the offense of aggravated driving under the influence of alcohol – causing death, Class 2 felony. In accordance with Illinois law, Aca Osorio must serve 85 percent of the sentence. He received credit for 24 days served in the Kane County jail. The sentencing range for this offense is between three to 14 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

Judge Julia Yetter accepted the plea.

Assistant State's Attorney Katy Flannagan stated the following facts in court: On May 7, 2023 at approximately 5:15 p.m., the defendant was driving a van in Batavia, Illinois when he rear-ended a motorcyclist who was driving in front of him. The defendant stopped a short distance away from the crash where he was located by officers and believed to be impaired. He ultimately submitted to a chemical breath sample which showed his breath alcohol concentration to be 0.204. The driver of the motorcycle was pronounced deceased as a result of the injuries he sustained from the crash.

ASA Flannagan said: "This entirely preventable traffic crash is another reminder that drinking and driving cannot only happen at any time of the day, but that it can have fatal consequences. I would like to thank the Batavia Police Department, victim advocate Linda Hagemann, Alliance Against Intoxicated Motorists Advocate Carrie Kilpatrick, and ASA Kelly Orland for their

assistance in this case. I would also like to thank the victim's family for their kindness, patience and understanding throughout this process. Today, I hope that they got the justice that they feel they deserved and can finally close this chapter of their lives to move onto the impossible task of healing the wounds left by the loss of their loved one. Driving Under the Influence will not be tolerated in Kane County, and I believe that this negotiated sentence sends that message clearly."
