BATAVIA MAN GETS SIX YEARS FOR CHILD PORNOGRAPHY

*RE: **David P. Winecke**: Age 67 (d.o.b. 8-21-1956), of the 1200 block of Hazelwood Court, Batavia, Illinois. Case No. 2022CF2374.*

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that **David P. Winecke** has agreed to a sentence of six years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections in exchange for a guilty plea to the offense of child pornography – disseminating, victim younger than 13, Class X felony.

Judge Alice C. Tracy accepted the plea.

Assistant State's Attorney Ken Hudson stated the following facts during the plea hearing:

Prior to December 20, 2022, Winecke disseminated and possessed multiple videos and still images of child pornography.

According to Illinois law, Winecke is eligible for day-for-day credit. He receives credit for time served in the Kane County jail. Winecke had been free on \$10,000 bond.

In addition to the prison term, Winecke must register for life as a sexual offender in accordance with the Illinois Sexual Offender Registration Act.

Winecke was identified and investigated by the Kane County Child Exploitation Unit, an initiative created by State's Attorney Mosser and Sheriff Ron Hain to investigate tips of individuals possessing or disseminating child pornography.

ASA Bob Dore, chief of the Kane County State's Attorney's Office's Criminal Division, said:

“Child pornography is not a victimless crime. Children depicted in sexually compromising images and videos are victimized every time someone views them, even decades later. My thanks to ASA Hudson, former Kane County ASA Margaret O'Brien, the Kane County Child Exploitation Unit, the Kane County Sheriff's Office, the Illinois Attorney General's Office, the High-Tech Crimes Bureau, and the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force.”
