### **ST. CHARLES TOWNSHIP MAN GETS 11 YEARS FOR CHILD SEX OFFENSES**

*RE: **Jesus J. Maciel Facio**: Age 35 (d.o.b. 7-6-1988), of the 38W5 block of Campton Hills Drive, St. Charles Township, Illinois. Case No. 2021CF1874.*

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser announces that Judge Alice Tracy has sentenced **Jesus J. Maciel Facio** to 11 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

On June 28, 2023, Judge Tracy found Maciel Facio guilty of the offenses of:

- Predatory criminal sexual assault of a child, Class X felony
- Aggravated criminal sexual abuse, Class 2 felony (3 counts)
- Indecent solicitation of a child, Class 3 felony

Maciel Facio waived his right to a jury trial.

Kane County Assistant State's Attorneys Tyler Cox and Morgan Wilkinson presented the following facts in court:

Between June 2016 and June 2019, Maciel Facio had sexual contact with the victim. Maciel Facio knew the victim, who was younger than 13 years old.

In addition to the prison sentence, Maciel Facio must register for life as a sexual offender in accordance with the Illinois Sexual Offender Registration Act.

The sentence is seven years for the predatory criminal sexual assault offense, four years for the two aggravated criminal sexual abuse offenses and two years for the indecent solicitation of a child offense. The four-year and two-year terms are to be served concurrent to one another, but consecutive to the seven-year term.

Maciel Facio must serve at least 85 percent of the seven-year term, and is eligible for day-for-day sentencing on the remainder of the sentence.

Maciel Facio receives credit for 83 days served in the Kane County jail and while on electronic home monitoring.

**ASA Cox said:** “I hope this prison sentence provides some peace of mind for the victim and her family. The victim remained strong from the beginning of this criminal investigation until the day the defendant was held accountable for his actions and sent to prison. Thanks to the great staff at the Kane County Child Advocacy Center for their support, particularly ASA Wilkinson, victim advocate Julie Pohlman and Det. Deanna Velazquez of the Kane County Sheriff’s Office.”
